High quality, developmentally appropriate care opportunities will be available for preschool aged children.


Mission

The Screening Process

Invitations sent to families to attend one of three sessions. Related service providers on-hand to assist with observations. Simultaneous screening and parent information sessions.

Screening Plan and Observations (40 minutes total)

Arrival (5 min)

- Name tags
- Student Photos
- Parents move to conference room

Circle (15 min)

- Story: Ten Little Fish by Audrey Wood
- Song: The Goldfish by Laurie Berkner

Free play (20 min)

- OT/PT and Speech: Pull small groups during this time to screen
 - Expressive and receptive language
 - Gross and fine motor
- Center activities and table toys

What does our preschool program have to offer?


- A nurturing and inclusive early childhood environment


